All Souls' Day is the natural extension of All Saints' Day. Tonight we personalize the Liturgy and our prayers by remembering and thanking God for the lives of our parents, grandparents, children, grandchildren, family, friends and many others we have known who have loved us and whom we have loved...it is our hope to be reunited with them in heaven...
